The meeting commenced at 6.20pm.

1. Welcome:

The Chair welcomed participants to the meeting.

Three residents, David Hay, Jim Buckham and Kathy Buckham, attended the meeting and addressed the Committee. All three residents live in the Quail Rise / Manata Green area and were speaking to their complaints regarding low flying light aircraft.

Mr Hay outlined his concerns regarding the increased number of light commercial aircraft that fly over his house every 2 hours from 8am each day. He believes they are lower than 1000ft, and not following the correct flight path. He is concerned at the noise pollution they are creating. His wife is unable to do her gardening unless she wears ear protection.

Mr and Mrs Buckham are also concerned with the number and height of the small aircraft flying over their home. They also believe the aircraft are flying over their property at approximately 7-800 ft.

A general discussion took place on the height and flight path of the aircraft. It was confirmed that the cruise climb is the main point of contention with the residents, along with not following the correct flight path over Shotover River.

Dave Matthews confirmed that the requirement to be at 1000ft does not apply when an aircraft is landing or taking off.

Clayton confirmed that it is the pilot's responsibility to follow the correct flight path, and that they should be tracking on or east of the Shotover River.

The Chair thanked the residents for coming along to the meeting. Mr Hay and Mr and Mrs Buckham left the meeting at 6.45pm.

Greg Miller arrived 6.35pm

After discussion by the Committee, it was agreed that Mike Clay, Clayton Lightfoot and Dave Matthews would attend a QMUG meeting to discuss the complaints received and reinforce the flight path that should be taken. Clayton will also send out a reminder to all pilots of the correct flight path. It was also suggested a meeting with QLDC CEO Mike Theelen, Colin Keel and Clayton Lightfoot to discuss flight paths and movement control would be beneficial.







Operational Report

2016 AANC Compliance Contours

Preliminary 2016 Annual Aircraft Noise Contours (AANC) were presented to the Noise Liaison Committee at the last meeting. Since then, noise monitoring has taken place, over July / August. This monitoring enables adjustments to be made to the model in relation to actual aircraft noise recorded to make the model more accurate. The initial outcomes of this modelling will be prepared later this year, and the 2016 Compliance AANC will be made available to the Noise Liaison Committee at the next meeting.

Noise Mitigation Program

We have completed the work on 80 McBride Street and are preparing for it to be used as temporary accommodation for the Inner Noise Mitigation Program. The internal work on 98B McBride is scheduled to be completed on the 8th of September and the external work completed around the 12th September. Work continues in preparation for the householder consultation for the Mid Noise Program now we have revised the specification.

QAC Master Plan Options

QAC has prepared a document summarising the Master Plan Options for Queenstown Airport for the community's consideration which was publically released on 29th August. We are now at the start of a two-month community engagement programme which includes airport community sessions, presentations to a broad range of community, business and tourism groups, and public 'fly-in' visits in high foot traffic locations across Queenstown, Arrowtown, Wanaka, Glenorchy, Kingston and Central. Our senior leadership team will be taking turns travelling around the region during September and October to present at or man these sessions.

The Master Plan Options summary document we've put together is the main source of printed information and we have also created a dedicated section on our website (www.queenstownairport.co.nz/masterplan) which includes a downloadable summary document, factsheets and, most importantly, a link to the survey we'd like people to fill out so that we can collate their feedback. A schedule of public events will also be posted there once all of the sessions around the region are confirmed.

We're keen for everyone to have the opportunity to have their say on the airport's future and encourage all of the community to attend our sessions and give us their feedback.

The Chair welcomed participants to the meeting.

There were no residents or complainants that wished to address the committee at this meeting.

2. Minutes of Last Meeting

The minutes from the Queenstown Airport Liaison Committee on 18 September 2017 were accepted by the Committee as a true and correct record.

There were no Matters Arising from this meeting.

It was noted two noise complaints had been received and were summarised in Appendix A. A brief discussion was held in relation to the two complaints, which the Committee was satisfied had been appropriately investigated and communicated to the complainants.

• Community Feedback

The Senior Leadership Team have now completed a 3 month community engagement programme for the Master Plan which has resulted in high public and media interest. The website-based survey closes on 30 November, after which feedback will be collated, analysed and considered.

5. Operational Reporting

The Operational Report was taken as read.

• 2016 AANC Compliance Contours

Mike Clay presented the revised AANC contours.

The initial 2016 AANC contours were presented to the Noise Liaison Committee earlier in 2017.

It was noted that the previous version was based only on modelling. That version has now been validated by monitoring, based on the peak winter season. Further monitoring will happen over the peak summer season (Feb/Mar) to feed into the next AANC.

The notable changes between the previous version and this version are at the eastern end of the 55dB (OCB) contour:

- a) There is a difference in the proportion of scheduled aircraft actually using the RNP tracks vs what was modelled.
- b) There have been some adjustments in the actual tracks used by aircraft due to the surrounding terrain. When the tracks were first modelled, the model had some discrepancies in relation to the underlying terrain. The modelling software has since improved, and the model now more accurately reflects the actual tracks aircraft fly in relation to the terrain.

Noise Mitigation Programme

Diarmuid Holton, RCP updated the Committee on the noise mitigation programme to date.

A revised specification has been prepared in line with recommendations made to the new QLDC District Plan and included in the contract for the works. Accordingly, these specifications presently need to be agreed by the home owner.

Diarmuid is to send an update to all the Mid Noise home owners prior to Christmas 2017, liaising with the QAC Manager - Communications & Community.

6. General Business

Bob Fletcher advised that he is retiring as the Board of Air Line Representatives of New Zealand (BARNES) representative, following a handover at the next meeting. BARNZ representation to be confirmed.
